

# Troop 1999 Summer Camp Packing List

## Camp Cris Dobbins – 2022

### Turned Into Adult Leadership

- Medical forms submitted to camp web site
- Money Envelope for Scout (optional)
- Prescription Medications (in original container)

### Scout Uniform for Travel

- Scout Shirt (all patches secured)
- Troop T-shirt, worn under Scout Shirt
- Scout Shorts or Pants with Belt
- Watch (leaders need one with an alarm)
- Pocket Knife (with Totin' Chip or leader supervision)
- Troop Hat (worn always – sunlight is strong)
- Hiking Shoes or Boots (no open-toed or crocs)
- Scout Socks
- Wallet
- Do *NOT* bring Troop Neckerchief or Slide

### Daypack – Travels with Scout

- Sturdy Rain Gear
- Daypack Cover (optional)
- 1 Quart/Liter Sturdy Water Bottle, Filled
- Personal First Aid Kit
- Small Flashlight (AA or smaller batteries)
- Scout Handbook
- Magnetic Compass
- Sunscreen
- Lip Balm (optional)
- Bandana or Handkerchief
- Whistle (for emergencies)
- Swim Suit
- Towel
- Camera (optional)

### Padlocked Footlocker (15"x17"x32" maximum)

- Clothing (see clothing list below)
- Pillow (may be with sleeping bag)
- Toiletries
  - (2) Towels
  - Washcloth
  - Metal or Acrylic Mirror
  - Soap in a Plastic Soap Container
  - Shampoo
  - Deodorant
  - Toothbrush
  - Toothpaste
  - Dental Floss (optional)
  - Comb and/or Brush
  - Shaving Gear (if applicable)
- (3) Heavy Duty 30-Gallon Plastic Trash Bags
- Spare Shoes (no open-toed)
- Shower Shoes (optional, crocs OK)
- Dirty Clothes Bag (nylon or cloth)
- Spare Flashlight Batteries
- Battery Powered Fan (optional)
- Sundries
  - Insect Repellent (pump spray) (optional)
  - Wet Ones (travel pack)
  - Kleenex (travel pack)
  - (8) Clothespins
  - (3) Plastic Hangers
  - Clothes Line
  - Small Sewing Kit
- Pen and Pencil
- Small Notebook or Notepad
- Paper (needed for some merit badges)
- Cup with a Handle
- Work Gloves (for Conservation Project)
- Optional Items
  - Sunglasses
  - Camera
  - Reading Materials
  - Non-electronic Travel-size Games
  - Bible or Prayer Book (according to faith)
- No tarp needed.- you can use the troop tarps.*

## Trailer Items Packed Separately

- Sleeping Bag or Bedroll in a Stuff Sack
- Folding/Collapsible Cot

- Folding Chair
- Pillow (may use in car)

## Clothing List

- Official Uniform
  - (2) Short-Sleeve Scout Shirts (with badges and insignia sewn in the correct locations)
  - (2) Scout Shorts or Pants
  - (2) Official Scout Socks
  - Scout Belt
  - Troop Hat
  - OA Sash (if applicable)
  - Do *NOT* bring Troop Neckerchief or Slide
- Activity Uniform
  - (7) Scouting-Friendly T-shirts
  - (2) Hiking Shorts or Pants
  - (7) Pairs of Hiking Socks
  - (7) Sets of Underwear
- Sleepwear
- One Set of Clothes in Plastic Bag (for the last day driving home)
- Swimsuit
- Lightweight Jacket (early morning can be cool)

## Other Notes:

- **ALL** items are **MANDATORY** unless noted or discussed with the Scoutmaster. Other gear not in conflict with the rules below may be packed, not to exceed the space inside your daypack and footlocker.
- Both Saturday nights of travel we will stay in a hotel. We will not have access to the footlockers those nights, so for our travel out and back you may want a change of underclothes and your toothbrush with you in your daypack. We will not have access to our footlockers until after arrival at camp on Sunday.
- Know your lock combination and **KEEP IT LOCKED!** Provide the Scoutmaster or Assistant Scoutmaster with a copy of the combination written down in the money envelope.
- Money envelope – if the scout wishes to give the money to the Assistant Scoutmaster acting as banker, please put it in an envelope with the Scout's name and total amount on the outside.
- Plainly mark all of your gear with your name and "T1999", including your pack, cot, hat, and footlocker.
- Scouts will use the **BUDDY SYSTEM** at all times. If you don't know what that means, ask your SPL.
- Weather – expect warm days and pleasant to cool nights. Rain can occur at any time, most often as afternoon showers. Average highs are in the lower 80's and lows in the lower 50's.
- **ALL MEDICATION** must be clearly labeled as to what it is, with the troop and scout's name, assembled in a Zip-Lock Bag. Clear instructions should be included with the medical forms. Per Colorado regulations, all medications for youth must be dispensed by camp medics.
- **Games, music players, cell phones**, and other non-medical electronic devices can be used **ONLY** during the trip to and from camp at the Scoutmaster's discretion. During camp they must be locked up in a vehicle and not used there, or they **WILL** be removed and not returned until we arrive back at camp.
- Check your **merit badge requirements** – there may be other items needed that are not on this list. Most classes are asking that you have the merit badge book or have a buddy to share one. Swimming merit badge requires long pants and a long sleeve shirt – nylon pants are recommended. Horseback riding requires long pants and shoes with a heel.
